General criteria for all scholarships

1. The applicant must be a member in good standing of the Wisconsin Association of FFA through membership in a recognized FFA chapter.
2. The applicant must be at least a senior in high school or already enrolled in college and have maintained a satisfactory scholastic record in school.
3. The applicant must major in a program offered through an accredited university or technical college with special consideration given to students with interests in agriculture, unless specified by the sponsor.

GROWMARK		Qualified candidates: (a) preference given to applicants who are the son or daughter of an FS customer or the son or daughter of an FS employee, (b) must be enrolled or planning to enroll in a two-year agriculture-related program conducted at a technical college, and (c) must be a high school senior or in their first year of the two-year program.
Kenneth K. Heideman Endowment		Recipients must be from the Clintonville, Marshfield, or New Holstein FFA Chapters and pursuing an agricultural career major at a school in the University of Wisconsin System.
Wisconsin Agri-Business Association		General criteria.
Farmer Community Giving, Organic Valley		The recipient must be high school senior from Viroqua, LaFarge, Westby, Kickapoo or Cashton FFA Chapter and pursuing a career in organic agriculture and/or agriculture.
Arnold and Katherine Cordes Endowment		The recipient must be planning to attend the University of Wisconsin-Madison, -Platteville, or -River Falls.

Rodney O. Kittelsen Endowment		Preference given to applicants from City of Monroe or Green County.

Bernie and Marty Staller Endowment		Recipient must be pursuing a four-year degree in agriculture education and indicate financial need.
Robert and Herta Laatsch Family Endowment		Preference given first to a graduate of Jefferson High School and second to a graduate of Beaver Dam High School.
Harold and Geneva Beals Endowment		General criteria.
Walter and Delores Bjoraker Endowment Fund		Recipient must be pursuing a degree in the broad field of agriculture at a four-year institution.
Mary Elstad and Dean P. Gagnon Endowment Fund		Recipient must be from minority cultures (e.g. Latino, Native American, African American, and Asian American) and must be pursuing either a two-year or a four-year degree in agriculture, biological sciences, or natural resources.
Elstad Brothers Endowment		Preference will be given to FFA members from the Boyceville or Glenwood City FFA Chapter pursuing a degree in agriculture. If no Boyceville or Glenwood City FFA members are eligible then second preference is given to students pursuing a degree in dairy science at a University of Wisconsin four or two year college.
Jon Anderson Scholarship		First preference goes to applicant from Iowa-Grant School District. If none, preference goes to Iowa County school districts.
