Proposal # 1

Motion: Proposed Constitutional Change

Amend Article XII – Committees

Strike “Work” and insert “Activities”

The article would read: “The President of the State Association shall appoint such committees as may be necessary. Committees shall include the Program of ‘Activities’ Committee.

Rationale: This would update the Constitution since Program of Work is no longer the appropriate term.

Proposal # 2

Motion: Proposed Constitutional Change

Amend Article XIII: Section C – Advisory Council

Strike out “but shall have no vote nor enter into the discussions unless called upon” and insert “and shall be allowed to discuss matters fully. They will receive a sustaining vote over the Executive Committee’s decisions.”

The article would read: “The Advisory Council shall meet with the Executive Committee, and shall be allowed to discuss matters fully. They will receive a sustaining vote over the Executive Committee’s decisions.”

Rationale: During Executive Committee meetings, the Advisory Council is given the opportunity to sustain the decisions of the committee and allowed to enter into discussion when they please, therefore this would update the Constitution to the practices being used today.
